ELCA Coach Launch provides a solid coaching foundation

Training

- Attend the two-day training event to learn, apply and practice good coaching skills.
- Complete all written and coaching triad assignments.
- Upon completion, you are a Level 1 coach in the ELCA.

Practice

- Use new skills by coaching two people for at least five sessions over twelve months.
- Work with a coach as you are developing your own coaching skills.

Labs

- Consider participating in a coaching lab to further develop your skills and a coaching specialty.
- Labs include: Stewardship and Discipleship, Mission Development and Congregational Vitality; Care for Creation.
- Labs under development: ELCA Hunger Coaching; Generosity Project
- Upon completion, you are a Level 2 coach in the ELCA.
